WELCOME TO OUR WORSHIP

For the month of August our main 10 o'clock worship will alternate between All Saints and P&J. Today we meet in P&J to celebrate the feast of the Transfiguration. On this feast day, we look at the extraordinary account of Jesus – soon to face the cross in Jerusalem – praying to his Father on top of the mountain and being "transfigured" in glory: his face is transformed and his clothes become dazzling white.

It is a reminder of the transformative power of prayer. This moment does not change Jesus's immediate fate: he will go on to die in Jerusalem – and yet in this moment of prayer, everything is reconfigured: we have a much fuller picture of Jesus' destiny than simply his impending death. We see Jesus alongside Moses as the embodiment of the law and alongside Elijah as the ultimate prophet. (If Peter, James and John were here now, I would love to ask them if the resurrected Jesus who appeared to the disciples so many times between his Resurrection and Ascension bore an uncanny resemblance to this transfigured Jesus. Might that be one way in which they recognised him, I wonder?)

The Transfiguration was certainly a very special moment - which Peter wants to capture by building shrines for Jesus, Moses and Elijah. In this holiday season, for those who have enjoyed any special holiday moments, we can be tempted to cling to them, feeling disappointed when they fade as we go back into our everyday lives. It is natural human instinct. Yet, it is not the moment itself that we are to hang on to or try to keep alive. It is more the revelation or insight that the moment brings, that we should retain. In the Transfiguration story the insight comes when God says: "this is my Son, my Chosen – listen to him," echoing the words that were spoken at Jesus' baptism when the Holy Spirit first came down upon him: "this is my Son, in whom I am well pleased." It is all about encounter with God, our Trinitarian God: we glimpse the work of the Father in Jesus, through the power of the Holy Spirit.

So, rather than trying to hang onto precious holiday moments, how can we allow ourselves to have our outlook on life transformed by them? What insights can we bring back with us? Pray to God to find out what that is... There will be something – whether we come back either refreshed – or, if it's been a rough holiday, with gratitude for our return!
