LETTER FROM MARK TO THE PARISH MARCH 2024

Dear Friends

In my ten years here, we have faced our fair share of challenges together, and have faced them faithfully, generously and with great resourcefulness and I thank you for all of that.

In more recent times however, God has been very good to us. We are enjoying the rebuilt All Saints, we have new people joining us, together we have renewed our worship, and we have many new opportunities to serve God and to enjoy him together.

We must assume he has given us these things for a purpose – to glorify him, to build his kingdom, to make him known. To achieve this in his name in changing times we must have a plan.

The ministry team, the PCC and I have a clear vision that we should continue to operate as one parish with 2 churches.

Strategically some might say that we should put our energy and resources into All Saints and let P&J take a back seat for a while. I do not believe that is what God wants from us. I believe that both churches should thrive, that people should be able to attend the church they feel most comfortable at and a service that allows them to worship in the way they feel comfortable.

Traditionally, Eucharistic (Communion) worship has been central to our worship programme, and I am determined that this should continue. However, when Cally leaves us we will have only one priest on our team, me!

There is no immediate prospect of a curate to replace Cally, and the parish cannot afford any other kind of full-time paid clergy.

Jane Jones will be ordained in July but as Deacon. She will not be an ordained priest until summer 2025, and so will not be able to celebrate communion until then.

We also have lots of people dipping their toe into serving God in new ways, which is exciting.

In time this will make all sorts of things possible, but in the medium-term things will have to be a little different.

From March each church will have two Parish Eucharist services per month and one other service e.g. morning prayer, café church.

Each church will also have one Sunday per month with no service. This for now, will be the only way to make it all work.

This programme should ensure that most weeks everyone will be able to go to the church of their choice, or the service of their choice but not necessarily both!

In a typical month the programme will look like this:

When there is a fifth Sunday in the month we will be all together at one or other of the churches for the Parish Eucharist.

The parish choir, worship choir, and our team of musicians will continue to serve both churches equally, which we believe is the right thing to do. God has blessed us with fabulous resources for ministry which I believe he wants us to share generously across the parish and between all our services.

We are so grateful to all those of you who are on our various rotas and those who have offered to serve in all sorts of ways, another example of how blessed we are!

However, there are some key roles we still need to fill if we are to function healthily as a parish.

We need a second church warden.

We need a treasurer.

We need a bookkeeper.

If we do not fill these roles come the AGM in April, we may have to seriously scale down some of the things we do, so please do think and pray hard about whether God might be calling you to one of these key roles.

We also need more people to be involved in all the other areas of ministry we have in our parish, and especially in ministry to children and young people, an area where we have struggled for years.

I firmly believe that God wants to bless us and for us to thrive and grow as a Parish, the shoots of new life are everywhere to be seen, so I am confident that together we will rise to these challenges and continue to see growth and fruitfulness across our parish as the future unfolds.

Thank you for all you are and all you do, for your patience and forbearance, and for all your support.
