PRESENTATION ON ISRAEL AND THE WESTBANK - Come and hear Roisin Lawrence on Sunday 28 September at 4pm in the Calthorpe Room at CotH. Roisin has recently returned from a three-month placement in the West Bank with the Ecumenical Accompaniment Programme in Palestine and Israel (EAPPI), where she witnessed and reported on human rights issues. She has spent the last 7 years in the charity sector, working both in the UK and internationally on a diverse range of issues, from human rights to poverty alleviation. Roisin holds a degree in Philosophy and Theology from the University of Oxford, and an MA in Gender Studies with a focus on the Middle East from SOAS University of London. She is also a trustee of Musalaha UK, an organisation promoting reconciliation between Israelis and Palestinians. Additionally, Roisin is a recent graduate of Tearfund's Young Theologian Programme, where she focused specifically on the integration of faith with her work for justice and human rights.

An inspiring textile exhibition by artist Jacqui Parkinson, featuring eighteen large-scale panels reflecting on the life of Jesus. Crafted with vibrant silks, metallic leathers, and gold leaf, these works are bold, beautiful, and deeply moving.
